

This was a very important day for us. Our newly elected District Eight Governor, Brenda Smith, and her twin sister, Past District Eight Governor and now District Eight Parliamentarian, Linda Smith paid our club a visit!. Your reporter was once again in CA so missed them. Bummer!

Governor Brenda had asked Katy not to plan a program for this day. She said she would *handle* the job. First she had all club members introduce themselves to her and then she began to share her Ideas and hopes with us.
