At 9:30am on **Jan. 5**th our plan was to present the Tennie Russell School with the alphabet phonics blocks we bought with the help of our Altrusa International Foundation grant. We were going to present the blocks, take the tubs into the classrooms, play with the children for a few minutes, and then go to our regular 11:30 meeting at the River Grill.





What we did **not** know was that the tubs had to be assembled... There were 13 classrooms, 26 tubs per room. Each tub had a set of stickers to be applied, one for the top of the lid, one for the inside of the lid, and one for the front of the tub. Then the items that went into the tabs had to identified and placed in them. There was a capitol letter, a lower case letter, and 6

items to be identified as starting with that letter, placed in each tub.

Many of these items were wrapped in the plastic that all but denies you entrance and we were using plastic pre-school scissors! The first tub took about ½ an hour. We got better. More helpers showed up and the items were being more easily recognized. We did the last 2 in 10 minutes each! We were able to finish 8 of them. The rest were finished by members who took them home to unsuspecting helpers for completion.

It was time to head for our meeting!

Charlotte's mother Elizabeth Weathers from the Fayetteville club was visiting that day as was Wendy Delarosa a guest of Tina's, and Soraya's mother Sylea Freed. Sylea is here for the duration of Soraya's pregnancy. Remember, she is having twins!

Arkansas Gives was introduced by Peggy as a one day fundraising event to be held on April 7, 2016. We will all notify our friends and raise some money for our projects!

Judy is working on our clubs hosting a Tea Party! It will be on a Sunday afternoon, and our guests will be invited to our next few meetings. Our goal is for new members!

Connie's work with the Tennie Russell School this year has been nothing short of amazing. In December, several members volunteered at the Scholastic Books Warehouse sale. Through those volunteer hours, our club earned 204 new books, worth \$1063. Connie also shared that through donations of reading buddies, a small stuffed animal such as a Beanie Baby, from our members, friends, and relatives, we have collected 520 reading buddies. There is enough for each student in the classroom, and one for each student to take home as part of our Christmas project. *All of these activities were at no cost to the club!*

President Katy read an email she received from the principal of the Tennie Russell School. In December, our club sent a Christmas gift for every student, 260 of them! Each child received a new book and a reading buddy, to have at home. All those happy little faces put similar happy faces on our members.

At our **Jan. 19**th meeting Connie gave a "**State of our Tennie Russell Project**" report. The highlights cover our participation at the school; all of the donations from other organizations on the local, state, and national level; and donations from individuals. To date, we've donated to the school; 520 reading Buddies (the beanie babies), 260 books, 264 treasure box books, 13 books for reading centers, 13 large story books for group reading, office supplies, teacher resources, and 533 articles of new or gently used clothing. Estimated value of these items donated is \$10,373. AND we're not finished! Connie, you go girl!!


