This is where we came in, by providing a book shelf and books. Children come with their parents, interact and read while laundry is being done. They can take a book home if they choose. Tina and Connie keep those Book Nooks full!

"Movement is the essence of good health and first we need to warm up muscles by stretching," she said. She added that slower movement *can* give you good physical fitness. She and two volunteers (Kris and Terri) demonstrated many exercises to stretch the neck, arms, sides, and waist. She had exercises for the lungs - breathe deep, for balance, (with a chair to lean on if needed) stand straight, lift one leg and stand on one leg with eyes open and then with eyes closed. For reflex, put your arm close to your side and form a

circle with your thumb and index fingers. Have someone drop a ruler through the circle and try to clasp it before it hits the ground. That turned out to be harder than it looked!
