The ladies who went to the **District Eight Conference** recounted the good times they had! The Club earned over \$925 in jewelry, purse, and scarf sales.

The **Fort Smith Club**, which hosted the event, gave out goodie bags. The actual bags were ones that *we* had given them. We received a Thank you note from the **Hot Springs Village Club** for the blankets our Club gave

them for their comfort care kits which they give to victims of rape. The **Deb Project** donated a quilt for us to take for the silent auction at Conference.

The two guest speakers were from Fort Smith. They dressed as, and recounted the lives of, Hanging Judge Parker and his wife Mary.

We all had a good time!

Connie reported for the Literacy Committee that we donated 30 books to **Helen R.** Walton Children's Enrichment Center.

Sammy sent us a Thank you card for our help at the **DEB Project** on April 5th. And they donated book pillows which will be used as prizes at a summer reading program.

Days for Girls – Gay reported that of the \$2,400 grant funds, \$2,304.60 has been used for panties, waterproof fabric for the shields, and the servicing of sewing and serge machines. Connie reported that 101 kits for women and girls went to the Ukraine border. Fifty went to northern Ecuador for girls rescued from human trafficking. She reported that we are close to our grant goal of 210 kits.

A small group of members went to the **Sulphur Springs Library** on **April 20th**. Those at the library, including the mayor, were very excited about our support. Karen M. observed that the Sulphur Springs Library is the sweetest old library in the sweetest old building. We donated a few more boxes of books to the library and they said, "We are making their children's library".

Ellen Farwell recently retired from the Bella Vista Library as the children's librarian. A book will be donated in her honor to the Bella Vista Library.

Altrusa International had a year-long One Million Books Challenge that ended May 31. During that year, our club distributed 6,850 books!!. Where do we get the books?!? We were able to pick out 26 boxes of books from the Friends of the Bentonville Library. Connie and Karen M. got adult books from the Bella Vista Animal Shelter garage sale. Sammy from the DEB Project got adult books for us from a realtor who was cleaning out a property.

DEB Project_Sammy was contacted by the Decatur School social worker who is concerned that families won't be able to use their vouchers for Samaritan Center-sponsored backpacks containing school supplies. The distribution is done at Arvest Ballpark in Springdale and families may not be able to afford the gas to get there and back.

Thomas Blackwell, Executive Director of Sharing and Caring of Benton County, spoke to us about this organization which focuses on brightening the lives of poor children. It began in 1984 as part of the Boys and Girls Club. In 2007, due to its success, the organization became independent with its own 501(c)(3) status. The primary focus is its Christmas program which involves providing individually-tailored Christmas gifts as well as necessities (food, socks, etc.) to families that have been referred to them for Christmas donations. Last year they provided Christmas gifts to 2700 kids in 980 families. Their other projects are providing money (it is given to school counselors) for scholarships and giving backpacks with school supplies to children who need them. They raise money through fund raisers and donations. They do not get federal or state funds. Volunteer opportunities include: Interview families to determine their needs, Shop for families, Help assemble the family donations, – this is done two weeks after Thanksgiving, Help distribute the donations – this is done at the Benton County Fairgrounds, and Help at a fund raiser.
