On **Sept. 27** Karen M. set us up to participate in the **Bella Vista POA Give Back program**. The Highlands Pub and Grill donated 10% of their sales that day to our Club!!

Karen M. reported that we received a *Thank you* letter from the **Gravette Library.** In the letter, Librarian Karen Benson wrote, *When the Arkansas State Librarian asked what made the biggest impact on the 2022 summer reading program, I replied that it was Altrusa volunteerism and support.*

For the **Altrusa International Foundation** grant for **Days for Girls** we had committed to completing 210 kits. We actually made 211 kits. In addition, we supplied 867 kit components to the Liberty Distribution Center. The 211 kits were distributed to; 50 to Northern Ecuador for women and girls rescued from sex trafficking, 101 to Ukraine, and 60 to Southern Ecuador. Gay has completed the required report to Altrusa International Foundation about the use of the Days for Girls grant funds. Lorrie Healy was very thankful for our efforts.

On **Oct. 6** New member Sue Terri G., and Sue M. set up a school-wide, book give-away at the **Thomas Jefferson Elementary School.**

Oct. 8 was the day for the **DEB Project Fashion Show**. Members Connie, Tina and Sue M. were on hand to greet guests, work at the registration table, and help with T-shirt sales. Some cute Therapy dogs were also at the show and **Thomas Jefferson Elementary School** is scheduled to receive one!







Club member Carrie has become a Community Ambassador for the **Single Parent Scholarship Fund.** One hundred and forty individuals were awarded scholarships for this semester. The organization has increased their scholarships by 25%. Full time students receive \$2,500 per semester, three-quarter students receive \$1,875, and half-time students get \$1,250, and \$100 to families to buy school supplies. This money can be used for direct educational costs and to pay a variety of household expenses including: utilities, rent, taxes, childcare.

We have a place for our *stuff!* We have signed a contract with **SpareBox Storage** in Gravette. The cost is \$99 a month for the unit plus \$9 a month for insurance. Gay has already purchased shelves for the new unit.

On Oct, 11th, at St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Bella Vista, our yearly **Spaghetti Dinner** was held! This was a new venue for us and our committee did a fabulous job! New spaghetti options included vegetarian sauce and gluten free pasta. Our \$10 Mystery Bags were, as usual, very popular and sold quick! New this year was wine! Proceeds had been ear-marked for our Dictionary Project in the past but IT technology has reduced the number needed. We have many other children's literacy projects that will benefit. The **DEB Project** bought 10 tickets and told us to give them out to the deserving!

Club members were joined in making this a success by friends and family!

























On **Oct. 22** club members volunteered at the **Bentonville Library Foundation Oz Kids Crit and Fall Fest**. In honor of **Make a Difference Day** we helped with race packet pickup, registered racers, gave away goody bags and gave each child a free book of their choice!
